Funding Opportunities

Program Cost

Students are required to take 30 on-campus credits and 30 internship credits to receive their master's degree. Approximate tuition for the entire program for the 2022 cohort: \$39,000.

There is no difference in cost for in-state or out-of-state students.

In recognition of the financial impacts of the pandemic and our commitment to accessible education, we have waived the Summer 2022 application fee for all domestic students.

Internships

Students who successfully complete the summer and fall coursework will have the opportunity to interview with partner companies.

Students selected by our company partners, or students who have found their own internships, will complete a program-required nine-month paid internship (\$4,000-\$6,000/month) to obtain handson training in an industrial, medical, academic, or government setting.

Average internship nine-month salary in 2021: \$43,500

Graduate Employee
